P1 - University of Novi Sad



Atanasijevic Jasna, (1979) is Assistant Professor at the Department of Mathematics and Informatics of the Faculty of Sciences, University of Novi Sad where she teaches finance and mathematical introduction to economics. She is coordinator of Erasmus plus KA2 project aiming to develop curricula in policymaking and policy analysis at three largest universities in Serbia with a help from renowned EU partners. She currently runs a research project in the area of big data analytics and ML and works as a consultant in the field of competitiveness and SME financing.

She has PhD in applied economics from University Paris 1 Sorbonne, master degree in finance from the University Toulouse 1 and bachelor's degree from the Faculty of economics, University of Belgrade.

From 2014 to 2018 she served as a director of Public policy secretariat of the Government of Serbia. She was in charge of the establishing of the new institution in the center of government promoting new practices of planning in public administration including result-based management, evidence based policy making and regulatory impact assessment. From 2009 to 2014, she was a chief economist of Hypo Alpe-Adria bank in Serbia. Before that, she worked as a researcher in a think tank as well as a consultant in the area of finance and economic policy.

She authored several studies and reports in applied economics and finance, some of them published in journals such as Comparative Economic Studies Journal and Eastern European Economics Journal. 

Vukovic Danilo is associate professor of sociology at the Faculty of Law, University of Belgrade. His fields of interest are empirical sociology of law (legal culture, lawmaking process, and the rule of law), as well as social policy in the post-socialist context. He has conducted researches on social accountability (Serbia and Cambodia, 2014 and 2015), access to justice and free legal aid (Serbia, 2012), lawmaking and policymaking process (Serbia, 2012 and 2013), legal profession (Serbia, Croatia, Bosnia and Herzegovina) as well as numerous policy-oriented researches, mainly in the fields of social policy and civil society in the area of South East Europe.
